

ROAD SAFETY ON SEVENTH AVENUE


REMINDER TO DRIVE WITH CARE FOR CHILDREN

Parents/ carers have expressed concern about safety for families on Seventh Avenue at school afternoon bell time. Please see the attached plan to show changes to parking zones near the school, with extra parking spaces now available. Inspections by Council have shown that:

- ✓ People are holding their child's hand to cross the road.
- ✓ Families are arriving at the school at different times from when the bell rings to 15 minutes later. This is great – it prevents a long queue and saves everyone frustration – well done!

Road Rules, with penalties for a school zone:

Some drivers blocked the Produce Store parking. Please support our Llandilo shops by leaving their parking free for customers.



Four drivers parked in the 'No Stopping' zone near the Children's Crossing. The 'No Stopping' zone is in place so drivers and pedestrians can see each other and so vehicles can proceed along the road. Parking here and obstructing traffic is illegal and dangerous.

Fine: \$337 and 2 demerit points


- Several drivers did three-point turns in driveways near the school. Some did not give way to pedestrians:
 - Conducting a U-turn or three point turn and failing to give way to a pedestrian on a footpath is illegal.
 - Doing a U-turn without view of approaching traffic or while obstructing traffic is illegal.
 - Please find a safe place away from school to do a U-turn.

School bell time can get busy –plan your trip to avoid the crowds. If the parking spaces near the school are full, park and wait to move closer once other families leave. Let your child know that you will arrive a few minutes after the bell once the rush settles.
